After arriving in the United States, she heard about SAVES, a program sponsored by the Department of Children and Families that opens its doors by providing opportunities to immigrants to learn English and the SAVES representatives for and enroll in vocational courses to achieve their goals in finding better employments and becoming self-sufficient.
